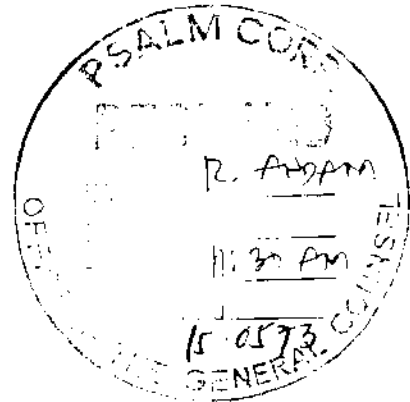

ORDER

On November 26, 2014, the Power Sector Assets and Liabilities Management Corporation (PSALM) filed an application for the approval of Contracts for the Supply of Electric Energy (CSEEs) entered with Distribution Utilities (DUs) located in Visayas Grid, with prayer for the issuance of provisional authority.

In the said application, PSALM alleged, among others, that:

1. The instant application is for the approval of the terms and conditions of the CSEEs entered into by and between PSALM and eighteen (18) Distribution Utilities (DUs) located in the Visayas Grid pursuant to Section 67 of Republic Act No. 9136 (R.A. No. 9136) or the "Electric Power Industry Reform Act of 2001" or the EPIRA;

2. It filed similar applications in 2011 and 2012 for the approval of the terms and conditions of CSEEs effective December 26, 2010 to December 25, 2011 and December 26, 2011 to December 25, 2012, respectively;
3. On March 21, 2013, it filed an Application for approval of various Letters of Agreement (LOAs) entered into with the DUs in the Visayas Grid, with prayer for the issuance of a provisional authority to extend the duration of the CSEE as requested by the various DUs in the Visayas Grid, for the period December 26, 2012 to June 25, 2013;
4. The LOAs extended the duration of the DUs' respective CSEEs only to June 25, 2013 due to the scheduled bidding for the privatization of the IPP contract of the Unified Leyte Geothermal Power Plant (Unified Leyte) in September 2012 and the expected turn over date to the IPP Administrators in March 2013;
5. However, the planned privatization of the IPP contract of Unified Leyte in September 2012 did not push through. Consequently, the bidding was rescheduled to the last quarter of 2013 subject to the approval by PSALM's Board of Directors;
6. Subsequently, an Application for the Approval of the terms and conditions of the CSEEs to cover the remaining period of 2013, which was from June 26, 2013 to December 25, 2013 was thereafter filed;
7. It is a government-owned and controlled corporation (GOCC) created by virtue of R.A. No. 9136, with principal office address at 7th Floor, Bankmer Building, 6756 Ayala Avenue, Makati City;
8. Pursuant to Section 49 of R.A. No. 9136 and the consequent assignment on May 11, 2009 (Annex "A") of all power supply contracts of National Power Corporation (NPC) to PSALM, NPC assigned and transferred to PSALM all of NPC's rights and obligations in, to and under its CSEE and other similarly or substantially equivalent power supply contracts with NPC power customers (collectively referred to as Power Supply Contracts);

9. On and from May 11, 2009, the power supply contracts are deemed amended as follows: (i) all references to NPC in the supply contracts shall be treated as references to PSALM; (ii) PSALM shall be deemed the SUPPLIER under the Power Supply Contracts; and (iii) the rights and obligations of the Parties shall be governed by and construed in accordance with the Power Supply Contracts, as amended by the May 11, 2009 Letter Agreement. Thus, the instant application;

Terms and conditions of the CSEE under ERC Case No. 2012-008

10. On July 7, 2005, the Commission issued Resolution No. 08, Series of 2005 approving and adopting the template for the Transition Supply Contract (TSC). On August 9, 2005, said template for the TSC was later on amended by the Commission in its Resolution No. 15, Series of 2005;
11. In the Commission's Resolution No. 33, Series of 2006 or a "*Resolution Clarifying the Purpose of the Adoption of the TSC Template*", the Commission clarified that the TSC Template should serve as a mere guide for the DUs and NPC and should not be construed as the contract contemplated under Section 67 of R.A. No. 9136;
12. In ERC Case No. 2012-008 RC, PSALM introduced the following revisions¹ to the CSEEs executed with the DUs in the Visayas Grid, which CSEEs were submitted before the Commission:

12.1 **CONTRACT DURATION** - This Contract consisting of the Transition Supply Contract (TSC) shall remain in full force and effect from 26 December 2011 to 25 December 2012 or one year after the declaration of open access by the DOE, whichever comes first. Unless otherwise provided, the applicable provisions of this Contract shall be deemed modified by the applicable WESM Rules.

12.2 Insertion of a new provision under **CONTRACT ENERGY** - *The CUSTOMER shall nominate month-ahead its hourly and daily energy quantity requirements three (3) days before the start of the next billing period. On a day to day transaction the CUSTOMER shall confirm the schedule of hourly energy requirements to PSALM on the day ahead. PSALM shall declare to WESM the schedule of hourly energy requirements delivered to customers immediately on the day after.*

12.3 **AVAILABILITY OF SUPPLY** - SUPPLIER shall supply the Contract Energy in accordance with good utility practice and in compliance with appropriate rules and regulations such as the Philippine Grid Code, and Open Access Transmission Service (OATS). Supply of energy shall be available except for interruption or reduction due to: a) causes beyond the control of SUPPLIER despite the exercise of due care, including but not limited to privatization of the assets of the National Power Corporation pursuant to the EPIRA; xxx.

12.4 Deletion of Sections 4.6 and 4.7 on BUY-OUT, which was replaced by:

APPLICATION FOR DECREASE IN CONTRACT ENERGY

4.6 *CUSTOMER shall be entitled to a reduction in its Contract Energy only upon written application to SUPPLIER at least sixty (60) days prior to the effectivity of the reduction in Contracted Energy, subject to the approval by the SUPPLIER.*

4.7 *CUSTOMER may be allowed to reduce its Contract Energy with the following conditions:*

x x x

4.7.3 *The reduction is due to self-generation or transfer to another power supplier. The CUSTOMER must notify the SUPPLIER at least sixty (60) days prior to the effectivity of the reduction in the Contracted Energy.*

13.4 ASSIGNABILITY

4.8 Xxx. The assignee shall, by written instrument, assume the rights and obligations of SUPPLIER to CUSTOMER.

When a CUSTOMER has been assigned by the SUPPLIER to a Successor Generating Company (SGC) or Independent Power Producer Administrator (IPPA) by virtue of the privatization pursuant to the EPIRA, the CUSTOMER has the obligation to settle in full its overdue obligation, excluding those accounts already restructured, within thirty (30) days of the assignment. In the event the CUSTOMER fails to settle in full within the given period above, the CUSTOMER may opt to settle its overdue obligation by entering into a restructuring agreement with previous SUPPLIER (in this case, PSALM) based on DOE Circular No. DC 2010-05-0006 and No. DC 2010-08-0010 within forty-five (45) days, provided that CUSTOMER has shown proof it has tried its best to fully settle said obligation, excluding those accounts already restructured. Failure to restructure within the prescribed period will allow the previous SUPPLIER to resort to remedies as provided for in the aforementioned DOE Circulars.

13.5 BASIC ENERGY CHARGE (for Indirect WESM Members)

6.1 *The Basic Energy Charge (BEC) applied to the CUSTOMER's hourly energy consumption*

shall be the ERC-approved NPC/PSALM's Time of Use (TOU) generation rates, which is attached as Annex III, plus adjustments in the tariff such as, but not limited to Deferred Accounting Adjustments (DAAs) and the Incremental Currency Exchange Rate Adjustments (ICERA), the RA 9136 Mandatory Rate Reduction Adjustments; and upon commercial operation of the WESM, an adjustment to reflect the WESM line rental cost plus the Site Specific Loss Adjustment (SSLA) added in the meter data on an hourly basis. For energy consumption higher than one hundred twenty percent (120%) of the contracted level (applicable to CUSTOMERS who are Indirect WESM members), the basic energy charge to be applied shall be the prevailing ERC approved rate and other adjustments plus ten percent (10%) of such rate for the incremental increase beyond the one hundred twenty percent (120%) of contract energy. Upon the commercial operation of the WESM, the basic energy charge to be applied to the contracted energy shall be in accordance with Section 8.1 of this Contract.

6.1.1 *The BEC shall be applied to the CUSTOMER's hourly energy consumption based on the hourly nominated energy quantity mentioned in Section 4.1.1. For energy consumption higher than one hundred twenty percent (120%) of the CUSTOMER's hourly nominated quantity (applicable for CUSTOMERS who are Indirect WESM members), the rate to be applied shall be the BEC or the WESM Ex Post Nodal price, whichever is higher.*

13.6 BASIC ENERGY CHARGE (for Direct WESM Members)

6.1 The Basic Energy Charge (BEC) applied to the CUSTOMER's hourly energy consumption

shall be the ERC-approved NPC/PSALM's Time of Use (TOU) generation rates, which is attached as Annex III, plus adjustments in the tariff such as, but not limited to Deferred Accounting Adjustments (DAAs) and the Incremental Currency Exchange Rate Adjustments (ICERA), the RA 9136 Mandatory Rate Reduction Adjustments. Upon commercial operation of the WESM, the basic energy charge to be applied to the contracted energy shall be in accordance with Section 8.1 of this Contract.

Energy consumption higher than the contracted level (applicable to CUSTOMERS who are Direct WESM members), shall be sourced by the Customer from the Wholesale Electricity Spot Market at the Wholesale Electricity Spot Market rate and paid directly to the Philippine Electricity Market Corporation (PEMC).

6.1.1 The BEC shall be applied to the CUSTOMER's hourly energy consumption based on the hourly nominated energy quantity mentioned in Section 4.1.1.

14. The above revisions to the CSEEs were introduced (i) in consultation with the Department of Energy (DOE) and the National Electrification Administration (NEA) and (ii) with the approval of the DUs in the Visayas Grid. The revisions addressed apparent issues that may not have been considered in 2005. Likewise, the amendments were proposed to clarify recurring issues frequently subject of dispute;
15. The Commission in an Order dated March 12, 2012, provisionally approved the CSEEs with the DUs in the Visayas Grid in ERC Case No. 2012-008 RC. Subsequently, in a Decision dated February 25, 2013, the Commission approved the application filed by PSALM in ERC Case No. 2012-008 RC and consequently, made the provisional authority granted permanent;

Terms and conditions of the CSEE under ERC Case No. 2013-169

16. The only revision² made in the CSEEs under ERC Case No. 2013-169 is found in Section 4.1.1 on the provision on **CONTRACT ENERGY**, to wit:

4.1.1 The CUSTOMER shall nominate month-ahead its hourly and daily energy quantity requirements three (3) days before the start of the next billing period based on its Daily Load Profile as reflected in Annex 1a. On a day to day transaction the CUSTOMER shall confirm the schedule of hourly energy requirements to PSALM on the day ahead. The deviation between the month-ahead nomination and day ahead confirmation, if any, shall be within the tolerance limit of $\pm 10\%$. PSALM shall declare to WESM the schedule of hourly energy requirements delivered to customers immediately on the day after.

17. Aside from this, in order to optimize the utilization of the available capacity of the PSALM plants in the Visayas, the contracted energy of the customers were increased to at least eighty percent (80%) Load Factor for Direct WESM Members and at least seventy-five percent (75%) Load Factor for Indirect WESM Members Visayas Customers;
18. The Commission in its Decision dated December 9, 2013 approved the CSEEs with the DUs in the Visayas Grid in ERC Case No. 2013-169 RC;

The CSEEs of the Distribution Utilities located in the Visayas Grid

19. Pursuant to Section 5, Article III of the Commission's Guidelines for the Recovery of Costs for the Generation Component of the Distribution Utilities' (DUs) Rate, PSALM is filing the Application for the approval of CSEEs duly negotiated and executed with the following DUs in the Visayas Grid:

20. The said CSEEs, which have durations from December 26, 2013 to December 25, 2014, were executed based on the template approved by the Commission under Resolution No. 8, Series of 2005 as amended by Resolution No. 15, Series of 2005. Likewise, the CSEEs incorporated the minor changes previously proposed by PSALM and approved by the DUs, which changes were contained in the CSEEs approved by the Commission in PSALM’s Application in ERC Case No. 2012-008 RC and ERC Case No. 2013-169 RC;
21. The **revisions** made in the CSEEs under the present Application are found in (i) Annex 1 of the CSEEs which reflects the Contracted Energy and the corresponding equivalent demand; and (ii) Section 3.1⁴ on the provision on **CONTRACT DURATION**, to wit:
- 3.1 This Contract consisting of the Transition Supply Contract shall remain in full force and effect from 26 December 2013 to 25 December 2014 or upon the turn over date to the winning bidder for the administration of the contracted energy of the Unified Leyte Geothermal Power Plant, whichever comes first. Unless otherwise provided, the

applicable provisions of this Contract shall be deemed modified by the applicable WESM Rules.

22. Finally, in compliance with Section 4 (e) of Rule 3 of the EPIRA, Implementing Rules and Regulations (IRR) and the Commission's Resolution No. 38-2006, and in support of the instant Application for the approval of the CSEEs, a copy of the instant Application (including Annexes) was furnished to the Sangguniang Panlungsod of Makati City (Annex "C"). The Application (excluding Annexes) was also published in a newspaper of general circulation (Annex "D");

ALLEGATIONS IN SUPPORT FOR THE ISSUANCE OF PROVISIONAL AUTHORITY

23. PSALM acknowledges that the continued operation of the Distribution Utilities is indispensable to the economic efficiency of the franchise area they service, not to mention the ripple effect of that efficiency to the economic growth of the entire country. In order for these Distribution Utilities to continue lawfully drawing electricity from the grid, it is imperative that they enter into agreement with PSALM as Supplier for the supply of electricity, a contract of sale for electricity, hence the respective CSEEs;
24. The CSEEs of the above-listed DUs expired on December 25, 2013. Accordingly, a grant of provisionally authority to execute the CSEEs effective 26 December 2013 will benefit the DUs and will ultimately redound to the benefit of the end consumers. Attached as Annex "E" is the Affidavit of Atty. Beatriz Irina Denise C. Alazas, Department Manager, Electricity Trading Department, under the Office of the Vice President – Asset Management Group attesting to the above matters;
25. Pursuant to the Commission's "*Rules of Practice and Procedures*", the Commission may exercise its discretion by granting provisional authority or interim relief prior to a final decision;

26. It is understood that the interim relief sought by PSALM that may be granted by the Honorable Commission, shall be subject to adjustments and other conditions that the Commission may impose after hearing and final determination of the Honorable Commission.

PRAYER

27. It prays that the Commission: a) approves the duly negotiated CSEEs with eighteen (18) Distribution Utilities (DUs) in the Visayas Grid covering the period December 26, 2013 to December 25, 2014; and b) issue a Provisional Authority authorizing PSALM to implement the CSEEs with the concerned DUs in the Visayas Grid.

On March 19, 2015, PSALM filed an "*Urgent Motion for the Resetting of the Public Hearing*" praying that the public hearing of this case scheduled on April 21, 2015 be reset to another date on the ground of unavailability of its witness who is set to testify in ERC Case No. 2014-175 RC⁵ on the same date in Davao City.

Finding said motion meritorious, the same is hereby **GRANTED**. Accordingly, the instant application is hereby set anew for jurisdictional hearing, expository presentation, pre-trial conference and evidentiary hearing on **April 28, 2015 (Tuesday) at nine o'clock in the morning (9:00 A.M.), at Energy Regulatory Commission-Visayas Field Office (ERC-VFO), Saint Mary's Drive, Banilad, Cebu City.**

PSALM is hereby directed to cause the publication of the attached Notice of Public Hearing, at its own expense, twice (2x) for two (2) successive weeks in two (2) newspapers of general circulation in the Philippines, with the date of the last publication to be made not later than ten (10) days before the scheduled date of initial hearing. PSALM is also directed to inform the consumers, by any other means available and appropriate, of the filing of the instant application, its reasons therefor, and of the scheduled hearing thereon.

Let copies of the application, this Order, and the attached Notice of Public Hearing be furnished the Office of the Solicitor General (OSG), the Commission on Audit (COA), and the Committees on Energy of both Houses of Congress. They are hereby requested, if they so desire, to send their duly authorized representatives at the scheduled hearing.

Likewise, let copies of this Order and the attached Notice of Public Hearing be furnished the Offices of the Governors of the Provinces of Antique, Iloilo, Northern Samar, Samar, Negros Oriental, Negros Occidental, Cebu, Biliran, and Southern Leyte, and the Mayors of Makati City and Quezon City for the appropriate posting thereof on their respective bulletin boards.

PSALM is hereby directed to furnish all those making requests therefor with copies of the application and its attachments, subject to reimbursement of reasonable photocopying costs.

On the date of the initial hearing and pre-trial conference, PSALM must submit to the Commission its written Compliance with the jurisdictional requirements attaching therewith, methodically arranged and duly marked, the evidences on the actual posting and publication of the Notice of Public Hearing consisting of certifications issued to that effect, signed by the afore-mentioned Governors and Mayor or their duly authorized representatives, bearing the seals of their offices, and the affidavits of the Editor or Business Managers of the newspapers where the said Notice of Public Hearing were published together with the complete issues of the said newspapers, and such other proofs of compliance with the requirements of the Commission.

PSALM and all interested parties are directed to submit, at least five (5) days before the date of initial hearing and pre-trial conference, their respective Pre-Trial Briefs containing, among others:

- (a) A summary of admitted facts and proposed stipulation of facts;
- (b) The issues to be tried or resolved;
- (c) The documents or exhibits to be presented, stating the purposes thereof and proposed markings therefore; and

- (d) The number and names of the witnesses, with their written testimonies in an individual affidavit form, to be attached to the Pre-Trial Brief.

Failure of PSALM to submit the required Pre-Trial Brief and Judicial Affidavits of its witnesses within the prescribed period shall be a ground for cancellation of the scheduled hearing, and the resetting of which shall be six (6) months from said date of cancellation.

As part of the pre-trial conference, PSALM must also be prepared to make an expository presentation of its application, aided by whatever communication medium that it may deem appropriate for the purpose, in order to put in plain words and explain, for the benefit of the consumers and other concerned parties, what the application is all about and the reasons and justifications being cited in support thereof.
